



AFT Staff Guild, 1521A Executive Board Meeting 6/8/2023

Article III: Districtwide Officers

Section 6. Vacancies:

- a. President: If for any reason the office of President is vacated, the First Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. The line of succession is as follows: First Vice President, then Second Vice President.
 - If neither <u>the</u> First nor Second Vice President can fill the position of President, there will be a special election if there are more than 6 months remaining in the term. In the event the First Vice President assumes the position of President, the Second Vice President shall assume the position of First Vice President.
- b. Grievance Secretary: Grievance Secretary of the Staff Guild is appointed by the Staff Guild President, after going through an interview process: The committee shall consist of five persons: the Staff Guild President, Executive Director or designee, First Vice President, and two sitting Grievance Representatives.

ARTICLE IV: EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 3. Duties for the Executive Board

GRIEVANCE REPRESENTATIVES: Grievance Representatives of the Staff Guild are elected appointed by the Staff Guild President, after going through an interview process: The committee shall consist of five persons: the Staff Guild President, Executive Director or designee, Grievance Secretary, one Chapter Chair, and one Grievance Representative to represent their worksite members at Executive Board Meetings and at the worksite. Grievance Representatives shall receive release time as determined by the Executive Board to assume their responsibilities. Grievance Representatives shall have one vote at Executive Board meetings Duties of the Grievance Representative include but are not limited to the following:

BY-LAWS

6. INTERNAL REVIEW (Internal Disputes)

- a. The Executive Board has established a procedure for internal review. An internal dispute refers to any member of the Staff Guild who feels aggrieved by a member of the staff guild or officer or officers of the Staff Guild. They may file a written complaint with the Executive Director.
- b. The written complaint then starts an initial investigation handled by the Executive Director. Should the complaint be against the Executive Director, the complaint then is forwarded to the President. The findings of the initial investigative procedure will then be presented to the Executive Board even if the complaint was handled at the lowest level. If the complaint was not resolved by the Executive Director, recommendations on how to proceed are presented to the Executive Board at this time—not to exceed sixty days from the filing of the complaint.
- c. The Executive Board by a two thirds majority vote may authorize a hearing to be conducted by a neutral arbitrator (from an FMCS list of seven arbitrators with names alternatively struck by the Executive Director and the complainant) paid for by the Staff Guild. A court reporter may be hired by the Staff Guild to produce a transcript of the hearing and organize hearing exhibits.
- d. After such hearing, the arbitrator shall submit their findings and recommendation to the Executive Board in writing.
- e. With a two thirds vote, the Executive Board may or may not adopt the recommendations of the Arbitrator. Should the recommendation not be deemed appropriate by the Executive Board, the Executive Board has the authority to determine a more suitable action after review of the hearing exhibits and transcript.
- f. The decision of the Executive Board shall be final and binding. The member may appeal to CFT and/or AFT.

KPFK, "Radio Powered by the People," offers news, public affairs, health, music, arts, and cultural programming that you cannot hear on commercial stations, or even National Public Radio. But this means Pacifica does not get the funding that flows into NPR and PBS stations from corporate sponsors and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. We rely on the free-will donations of our listeners and other forms of non-profit fundraising. In particular, we are developing an on-line auction system to bring in additional revenues, using BiddingOwl.com, a service used by many non-profits for such auctions.

Unique among media institutions, KPFK and Pacifica are democratically governed by boards elected by our listeners and staff. One -quarter of the Local Station Board are delegates elected by our staff, with the remaining Board members elected by listeners. This ensures our stakeholders and the communities we serve have a say-so about the policies and practices of the station.

Our partners, the Pacifica Radio Archives, located in the same building in North Hollywood as KPFK, are a unique repository of live coverage and speeches by figures in progressive movements over decades, including Paul Robeson, Dolores Huerta, Martin Luther King Jr., Cesar Chavez and others, as well as cultural figures, like John Coltrane, Bob Dylan as a young upcoming folk singer, Martin Sheen and Tom Morello.



INTERIM CHIEF OF STAFF REPORT

Brother Hugo Romero outlined the results from the COPE Board Meeting on May 10th regarding LA City Council District 6. The COPE Board did not reach a consensus and there was no recommendation. The Board held discussion about the lack of recommendation, motions were made, and a poll was conducted.

It was moved, seconded, and carried to recommend Marisa Alcaraz for the LA City Council District 6 seat.

Brother Rob Nothoff announced that based on a recent survey conducted by TPP, the Fed will hold a Homelessness Summit on October 5th. He also included updates on the Los Angeles City Hall's Municipal Lobbying Ordinance. Brother Steve Neal highlighted the organization's strike support efforts and announced that they will be working with the Los Angeles County's Department of Public Works on workforce development projects in the future. Brother Armando Olivas and Vice President Larry Brown reported live from the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger ® Food Drive. Sister Patricia Recinos [re]introduced herself as the new Organizing Director, and announced that there will be a multi-union action held during the CADEM's upcoming convention on 5/26 on Figueroa and 12th St in downtown Los Angeles.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Wheeler yielded time to Ellen Stutzman, Assistant Executive Director of Writers Guild of America West-who provided details of their ongoing strike. There was a discussion about the upcoming LACDP event at Universal Studios and how labor can support current and ongoing efforts by outside organizations to ensure they patronize union venues now and in the future. 
