- Met with the President of the LA county fed and his political director along with Ms. Newbold
- Presented the Board of Trustees our petitions to change the way we select commissioners
- Preparing for membership and IT meeting on Saturday

From this Retiree's point of view...by Fern Reisner

Hi everyone,

Due to great difficulty in an attempt to access money from my HRA, I decided (with AFT 1521A's Administrator Ruby Newbold's permission), to jump back into limited voluntary service to the Union, finding a need for a retired person, from our local, to consistently attend the Joint Labor Management Benefits Committee (JLMBC). This was to insure that the interests of the Retirees were being addressed. It seems that in the 2 years that I have been gone, we really didn't have anyone watching out for us regarding our health benefits. Some of the problems that I encountered were:

Our HRA accounts were swept of all monies we carried into retirement. We were told and assured that any money that we had in this account when we retired would be carried on into said retirement. We didn't have to use it or lose it prior to retirement. That apparently was not true, as Dorothy Bates and I found out. The District coded our resignation as a termination, and WageWorks (the company that administers the trust) did just that. They swept the money from our accounts. My suggestion to the Board of Trustees, as well as the JLMBC was to contact all retirees that would be affected (those who retired after 2010 when the HRA's were first funded) to inquire if they had tried to access the money in their HRA since they retired, and were turned away. This is being looked into by the JLMBC and the District's Risk Management. I will keep you updated on the situation as it progresses.

Secondly, in September, at the beginning of this open enrollment period for our health benefits, some of us (me included) were sent a letter from LACCD District Health Benefits informing us that people who wanted certain HMO's were being required to pay part of the premium because the premium costs had gone sky high. I found this perplexing since I personally have never signed up for an HMO, and was never required to pay any premium, therefore was confused as to why I had received this letter. I never could find out who exactly received this letter, and why specific retirees were chosen, and others not. It was not a uniform mailing. To make a long story short, this did affect about 32 retirees in total. I was contacted by retirees from Supervisors and Administrators and invited to join them addressing the Board of Trustees at the October 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting on this topic. The 3 of us then attended the October JLMBC, introduced ourselves as retirees and set to work informing the JLMBC of our concerns. In November, we "3 Retiree Amigos" again attended the JLMBC, as well as a Retiree Advisory Task Force specifically to address the concerns of Retiree's. In December, at the Retiree Advisory Task Force, we were informed that AFT 1521A had filed a grievance on the issue, had reached a settlement on the grievance with District

Best way to get there from the 110 North or South is to exist at Vernon, then go west to Western Avenue, then turn right/north onto Western Avenue. The bank is on the West side of the street at 4103 Western Avenue. If Western is closed for the parade, go left/West onto one of the side streets, turn right/North onto Saint Andrews Place, then turn right/East onto 41st Street and turn into the bank parking lot. Park against the wall furthest from the bank.

Thank you for your interest in the Elections Services of the American Arbitration Association. The estimated cost to fully administer your election with approximately 1,200 members, would be §8,900.

The responsibilities of the Association would include:

- Communicating with client / election committee at all times.
- Designing and preparing all election related materials, including 10 campus ballots and all envelopes, for election committee approval;
- Assigning specific ID #s for approximately <u>1,200</u> members to provide for ballot security and to ensure returned ballot legitimacy

- Management of undeliverable ballots and issuing duplicate ballots as requested by qualified voting members;
